# Snap-8 - preparation and dose math

These are calculation examples only. The concentration assumptions below are explicit so syringe units are never separated from vial strength and diluent volume.

## 0.05% topical formulation

**10 mg makes 20 mL; 100 mg makes 200 mL**

Concentration: 0.5 mg/mL

Topical formulation - no syringe conversion

## 0.10% topical formulation

**10 mg makes 10 mL; 100 mg makes 100 mL**

Concentration: 1 mg/mL

Topical formulation - no injection protocol

## Conversion table

| Final amount | 0.05% setup | 0.10% setup |
|--------------|-------------|-------------|
| 1 mL         | 0.5 mg      | 1 mg        |
| 10 mL        | 5 mg        | 10 mg       |
| 20 mL        | 10 mg       | 20 mg       |
| 100 mL       | 50 mg       | 100 mg      |

## CALCULATION CHECK

Always recalculate from the actual vial strength and diluent volume. A U-100 unit is 0.01 mL; it is not a dose by itself.

# Snap-8 - community-reported patterns
